WHAT IS LAMBDA LETTERS PROJECT?

Lambda Letters Project (LLP) is a statewide, 501(c)(4) nonprofit, lobbying organization.

OUR MISSION

To promote the social, economic, and human rights of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex individuals, couples, and families; people affected by HIV/AIDS; people of color; women; and people of low economic status. We urge elected officials to enact and support legislation that accomplishes this goal.

HOW WE DO IT

We help write, e-mail, and fax elected officials urging them to do the right thing. Last year, our members sent over one-quarter million letters and e-mail messages to elected officials.

Members learn of the issues we address through monthly mailings, a newsletter, sample letters, and e-mail alerts.

HOW WE CHOOSE OUR ISSUES

We survey our members periodically, consult other lobby groups, and keep a constant watch on the bills introduced in the legislature.

DO LEGISLATORS REALLY PAY ATTENTION TO OUR LETTERS?

YES, constituents, not lobbyists elect legislators. Legislators pay close attention to letters from the people in their districts particularly when they get an abundance of letters on a bill.

OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Delivers over one-quarter million letters and e-mail alerts to legislators each year.
- Publishes paper and electronic bill lists which help individuals and organizations track key legislation.
- Empowers individuals by helping them, with others, to speak with a powerful unified voice.
- Organizes community action by issuing monthly e-mail alerts on fast-breaking legislative issues.
- Promotes powerful alliances of different communities by supporting the legislative needs of diverse communities.
- Builds trust and support among legislators by volunteering to support their bills.
- Helps bring transgender and intersex people into the mainstream of civil rights activism by aggressively supporting their rights.
- Provides an information clearing house where people can learn how to register domestic partnerships, submit discrimination complaints, determine their legislators names, addresses and phone numbers, and learn of their legislators' voting records.

WHAT DOES IT COST TO JOIN?

Annual membership dues range from \$35 per person and \$60 per family. We never refuse membership because of a person's inability to pay dues.
